Students may choose to actually build their traps; students may bring in their traps on **Friday the 16th**.

What's Happening in Room 203

In writing, students have been researching an animal of their choice. They are using the facts that they discovered to write an informational piece. Each child's piece will be published in a book through Scholastic Publishing; they will also have a full-page illustration in the book. Orders are due Friday the 9th.

In word work, we are practicing cr, cl, fr, gl, gr blends. They have played taboo, explored a poem and found word wall words with these blends.

In our book clubs, students have been focusing on their retellings. We have created a quick

brainstorm chart in each group and then on Friday we used Ozobots to walk-through a path of the story that each group collaboratively created. This was a great lesson!

In math, students have been working with their double facts and combinations of 10. They have been looking for these within number equations to help them solve the problem.

In social studies, we are practicing our map skills. Students are creating a project inspired by *Me on the Map*.

In science, we are just starting our dental health unit. Students are learning about how to keep your teeth healthy.
