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## What's Happening in Room 203

In word work, we are practicing the "s" and "t" sound, but then also looking at what happens when you put those two constants together to get the "st" sound.

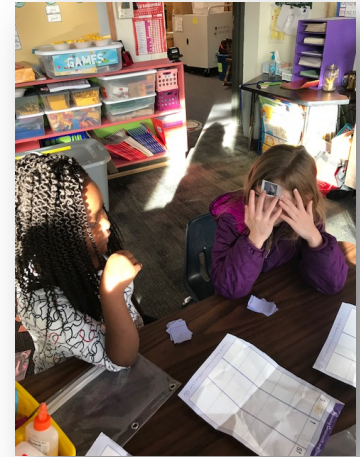
In our book clubs, students have been walking through their
